TODAY'S REFLECTION

The Bible is a story of love made up of two parts, the Old Testament and the New. They complement each other and cannot be understood separately. Some people thought Jesus came to wipe out the Old Testament. There are two reasons for this. In the first place, he teaches and interprets every law from the perspective of what is good for people. He dares to break the Sabbath. In the second place, there is the fact that he keeps saying that the poor, the persecuted and the oppressed are happy.

There are six instructions to live our lives but today we read only four. The first is: "You must not kill!" (21-26). It condemns all types of murder. No person should have power over the life of another, even that of a criminal. Is it really enough not to take the life of another person? No, it is not enough, says Jesus. There are people we swore we would never talk to again. For us they are dead people. There are others whom we have judged and condemned. It is as if they do not exist anymore; those we spoke ill of, those who have lost their joy in living because of us... these are all dead, even though they are still alive. The commandment "You shall not kill" has many implications. Those who use offensive language or get angry, or gossip, or hate others have killed.

Jesus (23-24) refers to a custom the Jews had. Before going to the temple to offer sacrifice they went through a series of purifications. Jesus tells his disciples not to bother with these rites. It is not the body that must be pure, but the heart. Reconciliation replaces, for Christians, all the purifications demanded by the old law. Jesus further speaks about adultery. For Jews that law only prohibited evil actions. For Jesus, the commandment goes deeper. There are friendships, feelings, relationships that are really adultery. Jesus insists that when we find ourselves in certain wrong or evil situations, we must just stop. How can we think we are at peace with God just because we have kept our exploits secret? Jesus states that husband and wife may not separate. God's plan is that marriage be indissoluble. However, we must not mock, gossip, condemn, or rejoice over those whose marriages have failed. We should give them our love.

We are born free and are accountable for our actions, for the way we live our lives. Physical and external situations can affect us of course, but we always retain the power to make decisions. We are at a crossroads, one-way leads to life, the other to death. We must choose between the two. God has pointed out to us how to avoid mistakes. The way to life is to follow the commandments of God; the way to death is to ignore them. This not a lack of freedom, on the contrary what God wants is for us to stop ruining our lives. If a driver of a car should disregard road signs, he would soon end up in a ditch and hurt himself. The "wisdom of God" has been revealed because God has begun to realise his plan. His plan is in operation. At the end of the world, we will be able to see it. It will be complete.
